OPEN CLASS GOATS**

**Entries due July 15<sup>th</sup>  
Animals in barn by 8 pm Tuesday  
Show Times: Wednesday, August 11, 3pm**

1. A stall fee of \$3.00 per animal will be charged on all entries in this department. Fess must accompany entry forms. Address entries to: Grays Harbor County Fair, P.O. Box 1229, Elma WA 98541.
2. Entries will not be accepted after July 16. All substitutions must be made by that date.
3. Pen space will be assigned by the Superintendent according to availability.
4. All animals must be in the barn, beginning at 2:00 pm and by 8:00 p.m. Tuesday.
5. Animals with horns are NOT ALLOWED. All animals must be either naturally polled, dehorned or disbudded. Large scars will be discriminated against.
6. There is a maximum of two entries per class per exhibitor.
7. All animals must be left outside the barn until the animals are checked with the superintendent. Superintendents have the authority to refuse entry until the animal is checked by a veterinarian.
8. Registered 4-H and FFA exhibitors both in-county and out of county clubs/chapters will be allowed to enter their purebred animals in open classes, and will be entitled to premium moneys. Appropriate stall fees must be paid by all exhibitors in open classes.
9. Exhibitors are required to perform herdsman duties. Exhibitors will be responsible for the entire care of their animals.
10. All animals on display at the Grays Harbor County Fair must be entered into competition, except with special permission of the Fair Board Animal Barn Committee and Department Superintendent.
11. In order to make the show run smoothly, classes will not be held an unreasonable length of time for late entries. The judge may exclude these animals from the judging ring.
12. Feed and supplies may be delivered to the barn before 9:30 a.m. and after 10:00 p.m. There will be no moving vehicles on the fairgrounds at any other times.
13. All ribbons and awards won must be put on display.
14. Exhibitors are responsible for modifying pens if necessary to confine goats.
15. All goats, including wethers, must have official USDA national Scrapie Eradication assigned flock identification. Check NIAA website for information [www.animalagriculture.org/scrapie](http://www.animalagriculture.org/scrapie).

8. Dam & Daughter, all breeds judged together (for ribbon awards only)
9. Farm Herd, to consist of 3 goats owned by one exhibitor (for ribbon awards only).
10. Junior Get of Sire (three doelings, yearly and younger, never in milk), ribbon awards only.
11. Produce of dam (two does, any age) ribbon awards only
12. Get of sire (three does, any age, ribbon awards only).

5. Senior Doe Kids (8 months to under 12 months of age).
6. Dry Yearlings (1 years and under 2 years)
7. Senior Does (under 2 years of age)
8. Senior Does (2 years and under 3 years).
9. Senior Does (3 years and under 4 years)
10. Senior Does (4 years and older)
11. Dam and Daughter (any age) Ribbon awards only
12. Junior Get of Sire (three doelings, yearly and younger, never in milk). Ribbon awards only.
13. Produce of dam (two does, any age) ribbon awards only.
14. Get of sire (three does, any age, ribbon awards only).
15. Best 3 females (3 does, any age, limit 1 herd per exhibitor) ribbon awards only

6. Senior Doe Kids (8 months to under 12 months of age).
7. Dry Yearlings (1 years and under 2 years)

8. Senior Does (under 2 years of age, must have freshened)
9. Senior Does (2 years and under 4 years).
10. Senior Does (4 years and older)
11. Dam and Daughter (any age) Ribbon awards only
12. Junior Get of Sire (three doelings, yearly and younger, never in milk) ribbon awards only.
13. Produce of dam (two does, any age) ribbon awards only.
14. Get of sire (three does, any age, ribbon awards only).
